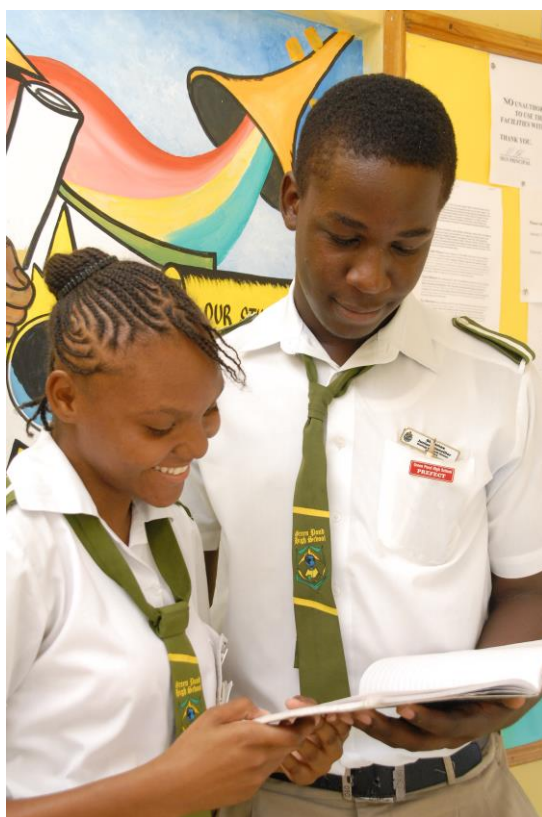


CARIBBEAN SECONDARY EDUCATION CERTIFICATE (CSEC) EXAMINATION 2014

ANALYSIS OF THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS' PERFORMANCE



Performance of Jamaican Candidates

The analysis presented is based on data obtained from the Caribbean Examination Council (CXC), for the June 2014 sitting of the CSEC Examination.

The results saw **274,434** subject entries at the General and Technical Proficiency level of which **258,989** were sat. There were 7,585 less entries in 2014 than in 2013. Additionally, the number of entries sat was 7,153 less than those sat in the previous year (**See Table 1**). Of the total sitting, **171,044** or 66.0% obtained grades 1-3. The Technical and Vocational area continued to show the highest percentage attainment rate, (**approx.80.0 %**) compared to Business, Arts and the Sciences. Mathematics and English Language, with the largest numbers of entries and sittings, recorded percentage passes of 48.9 and 58.8 percent respectively. When the average attainment rates for Mathematics and English Language were compared with 2013 results, there was saw a 14.8 and 2.2 percentage point increase, respectively.

Summary Performance of Public Schools

Summary of the 2014 CSEC Results for Public Schools

The information contained in the report on public schools includes the performance of Belair High School which is now a public secondary school.

A total of 36, 283 candidates were registered to sit the exams: (20,168 females and 16, 115 males).

A total of 35, 488 candidates actually sat: (19, 832 females and 15, 656 males).

A total of 30,597 attained grades 1-3 in at least one subject: (17, 655 females and 12, 942 males).

A total of 11,321 females obtained the required grades in English compared with 6,292 males. At the same time 7,444 females obtained grades 1-3 in Mathematics and 5519 males obtained similar grades.

Distribution of Candidates Passing 5 or More Subjects, with Mathematics and/or English

Passed 5 or more subjects (with English and/or Math): **13,682** (8,846 females and 4,836 males).

Passed 5 or more subjects (with English and Math): **9,130** (5,819 females and 3,311 males).

Passed 5 or more subjects (with English only): **3,559** (2,550 females and 1,009 males).

Passed 5 or more subjects (with Math only): **993** (477 females and 516 males).

Tables 5a and **5b** show the performance of the students in the subjects subsidised by Government and the Private Sector. Five of the subsidised subjects showed improved performance over 2013.

Analysis of Public Schools' Performance

Candidates Entered and Sat

Some **36,283** students were entered to sit the 2014 CSEC Examination, 16,115 males and 20,168 females. This represents approximately **87.4%** of the Grade 11 cohort of **41,515**. Of those entered, **35,488** or approximately **97.8%** sat the examinations; **19,832** females and **15,656** males. The number of students, who sat however, represented approximately **85.5%** of the Grade 11 cohort (**See Table 6**).

Subjects Entered and Sat

A total of **196,434** subject entries were from public secondary schools of which **189,812** were sat. As in previous years the number of subject entries by females exceeded those of the males. Females accounted for a total of **115,144** or approximately **58.6% of the entries** compared to **81,290 or 41.4%** for the males. Of the subjects that were sat, **135,368**, or **71.3%** were awarded grades 1-3. There were many more boys than girls in grade 11 cohort who did not sit any subjects in this exit examination.

Performance by Subject

Of the 35 subjects sat, 14 showed improvement in pass rates over 2013. The Arts and Sciences had increases in two and five subjects respectively while the Technical and Vocational category showed increase in seven subject areas. The Science and Technical and Vocational categories saw increases in the average pass rates with percentages of 6.5 and 0.6 respectively. The other two categories, Arts and Business saw decreases of 2.6 and 5.3 percentage points when compared to 2013. A comparison of the average pass rates by subject areas saw the Technical and Vocational category having the highest average pass rate (83.2%) which was approximately one percentage point higher than that of the previous year.

Three subjects had average pass rates of over 90%. These were Food and Nutrition, Home Economics Management and Physical Education and Sport. As was the case in 2013, the highest average pass rate of 97.2% was in Physical Education and Sport. This performance represented an increase of 1.6 percentage points over 2013.

In the Business category, Principles of Business had the highest pass rate of 82.5 percent, while the lowest percentage was recorded for Principles of Accounts as was the case in 2013. All subjects in the business category had decreases in their pass rates, ranging from 3.3 for Principles of Business to 11.7 percentage points for Economics.

The average attainment rate for the category of Arts decreased by 2.5 percentage points below that of 2013, moving from 69.5% to 67.0%. The rates ranged from 58.5% for Social Studies to 79.6% for French. Only two of the nine subjects in this category (English A and Music) saw percentage increases over 2013. Some 17,613 students passed English representing 42.4% of the Grade 11 cohort. Approximately 24.1% of the cohort passed both Mathematics and English Language compared to 18.0% in 2013. **See Appendix 1** for performance of secondary schools in English Language and Mathematics.

The Sciences saw average attainment rate of 65.4%, an increase from 58.9% in 2013. Human and Social Biology and Integrated Science saw decreases of 1.9 and 2.2 percentage points respectively when compared to 2013. It should be noted that Mathematics saw an increase of 13.3 percentage points, moving from 42.2 percent in 2013 to 55.5 percent in 2014. Some 12,963 students passed Mathematics representing 31.2% of the cohort. **Table 7** highlights the performance by subjects and **Appendix 2** shows the performance trend by subjects for the period 2010 – 2014.

Absent, Cancelled and Ungraded Subject Entries

The total subject entries for 2014 were 196,434 compared to 193,360 in 2013. This represents approximately two percentage points increase. The number of entries that were not sat in 2014 was 6,622 compared to 6,249 in 2013, an increase of approximately 6%.

Two subject categories (Arts and Sciences) showed increases in the percentage of entries not sat. Music and Religious Education were the main contributors for the Arts with 21.1 and 3.6 percent respectively. For the Sciences, Integrated Science and Additional Mathematics were the main contributors of 5.6 and 4.3 percent respectively. It is to be noted that the numbers represented in the Table as “did not sit” include two entries that were cancelled for visual arts . Three subjects (Building Technology - Woods, Music and Visual Arts) had the highest percentage of entries not sat ranging from 10.2 percent to 21.1 percent. As in 2013, the percentage of entries not sat in the Technical and Vocational Category remained unchanged. (See Appendix 3)

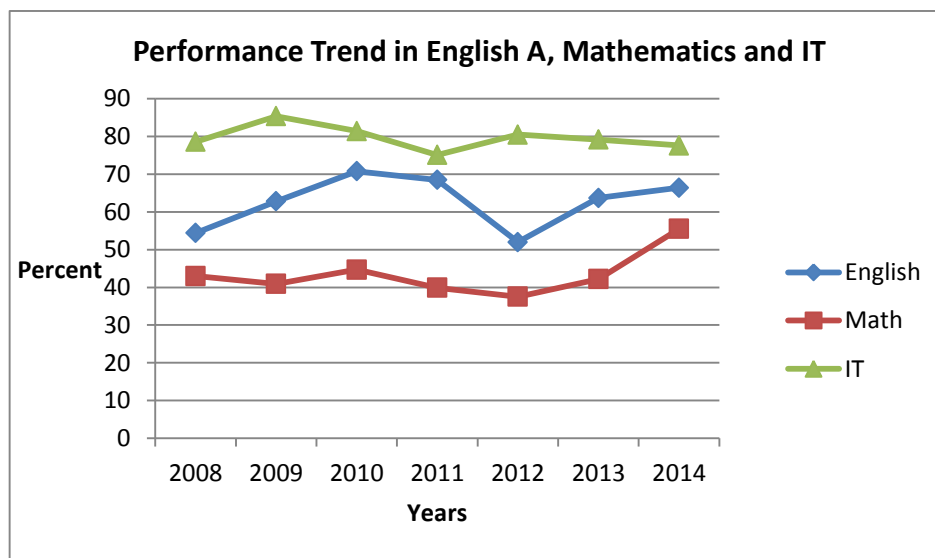
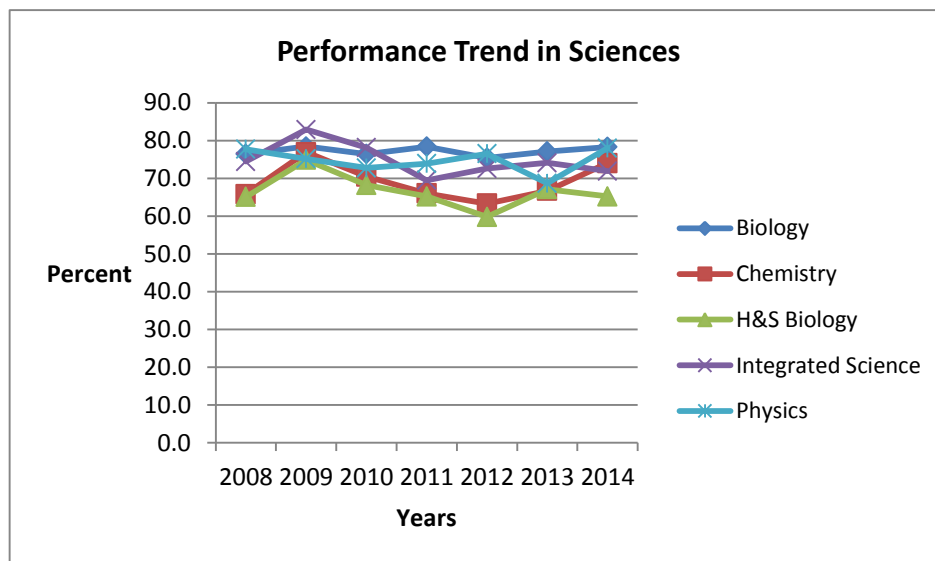

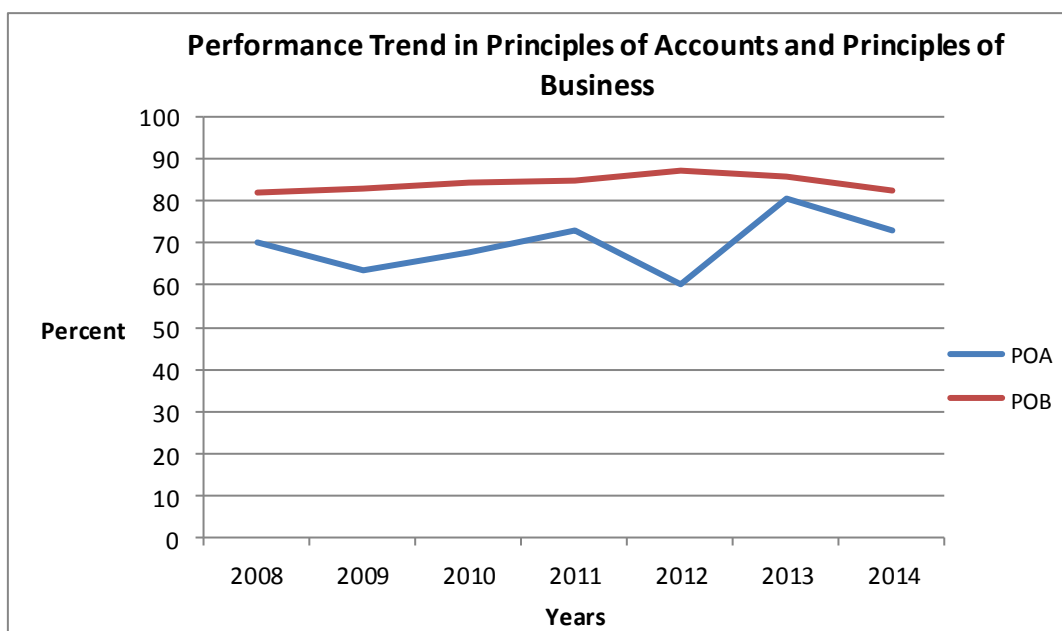
Performance in the Subjects Subsidised by Government and the Private Sector

The Government of Jamaica (GOJ) continues to provide incentives for four (4) subjects, namely English 'A', Mathematics, Information Technology and a Science subject while the private sector assists with Principles of Business and Principles of Accounts. Information Technology, Chemistry and Mathematics, three of the subjects subsidized by the Government saw reduction in the percentage of entries not sat. English Language, Biology, Physics, and Integrated Science, other subjects subsidised by the Government, saw slight percentage increases in the students who did not sit the examination. This ranged from 0.1 to 0.3 percent (See Appendix 3).

The Charts below show the performance trend in these subjects over the period 2008–2014.

Overall Performance of Public School Students by Number of Subjects Sat and Attained

Table 8a gives a breakdown of the number of subjects sat by individual students. Some 10.9% of the students sat one subject, a decrease of 0.1 percentage point when compared to 2013. Of the total 35,488 students who sat in 2014, approximately 37% sat less than five subjects, showing a reduction of one percentage point. In 2014, the maximum number of subjects sat by any one student was 16 while in 2013 it was 14.

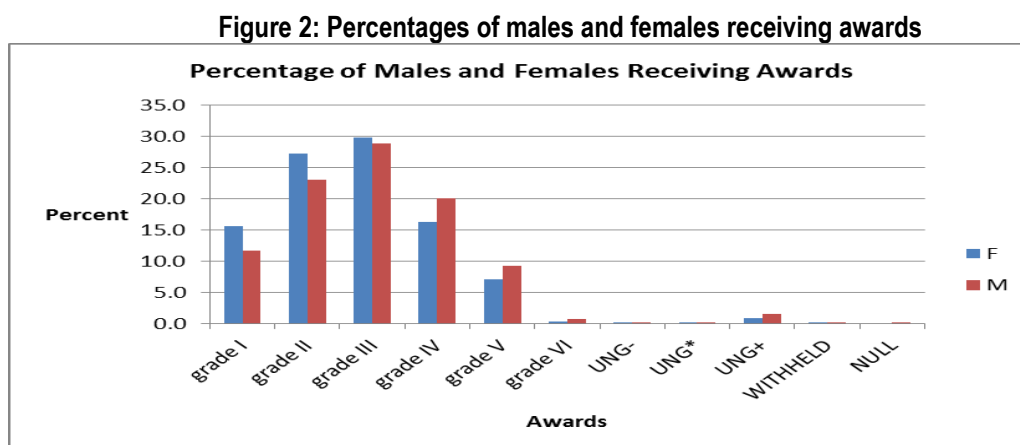
Table 8b highlights the number of students and the number of subjects attained. Of the 35,488 students who sat the examinations, 4,891 or 13.8% did not pass any subjects, a reduction of 0.3 percentage points when compared to 2013. **Appendix 4** provides further details of the number of subjects sat and passed by sex and **Appendix 5** provides trend data.

PERFORMANCE BY SEX

Of the 196,434 public school entries, 115,144 (58.6 %) were females while 81,290 (41.4%) were males. The performance by sex continues to show females receiving higher quality grades than their male counterparts (See Figure 2). Males outperformed the females in Additional Mathematics and Building Technology (Construction) by 4.7 and 3.8 percent respectively.



Performance of Traditional, New/ Upgraded and Technical /Agricultural Schools

Of the **189,812** subjects sat for the 2014 CSEC Examinations, 45.4% of those who sat was from Traditional High Schools, 39.6% from Upgraded High Schools, 9.8 from Technical High Schools and 5.1% and 0.1% from New and Agricultural High Schools respectively. Upgraded schools had a decline of 2.6 percentage points in the number of subjects sat while that of Agricultural schools remained constant. The other groups of schools saw increases in the percentage of total subjects sat ranging from 0.2 for Traditional Schools to 1.7 percentage points for New Schools The table below shows the performance of different types of schools.

The average pass rate for subject entries from Traditional High Schools continues to be the highest with approximately 86%, an increase of one percentage point over 2013. The other school types have rates ranging from 46.4% to 65.2%. New and Upgraded High Schools saw decreases in the average attainment rate of 0.2 and 1.6 percentage points respectively while Agricultural and Technical schools saw increases of 1.6 and 2.6 percentage points.

Matriculation to Tertiary Institutions

The core subjects for matriculation to tertiary level institutions are Mathematics and English 'A'. Matriculation for this purpose is defined as those students attaining grades 1-3 in five or more subjects including English 'A' and/or Mathematics. Of the Grade 11 cohort of 41,515 students, 26,527 or 63.9% sat English 'A' and 23,351 or 56.2% sat Mathematics. **Appendix 6** gives details of students' performance in English 'A' and/or Mathematics by sex, , region, parish, school type, type and school.

The 33.0 percent of the students who matriculated for tertiary level institutions represented an increase of 6.3 % points over 2013. See **Appendix 7** for further details on the students attaining five or more subjects. **Table 11** provides a trend analysis of students matriculating over the period 2010-2014.

The results continue to show that more females are matriculating than males. While 8,846 females matriculated, 4,836 males achieved similar status. The percentages of students matriculating by parish ranged from 17.7% in Hanover to 46.6% in St. Andrew. These two parishes showed an increase of 4.1 and 7.7 percentage points respectively.

Performance by Regions

All six regions experienced increase in performance in the Science category. There was a decrease in the Business category for all regions and only Region One saw an increase in the Technical and Vocational category. Region Two was the only region which had an increase in the Arts category. The increase in the Science category ranged from 5.3 in Region Three to 7.0

percentage points in Region One while in the Business Category the decrease ranged from 3.1 in Region One to 7.0 percentage points in Region Four. A breakdown of performance across regions is shown in **Appendix 8**.
