A BIKE FOR JOAN AT \$6,000

HOLLYWOOD. (Reuters) ACTRESS Joanne Woodward got a bicycle for her birthday yesterday — the most expensive bicycle in history.

It's the one her husband Paul Newman rode in his film "Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid".

Friends of the couple bought it for Joanne, 41, yesterday at the 20th Century-Fox auction of studio effects here last night. It cost them \$6,200 (TT).

They pulled 395 votes - 24 more than Solo Harmonites (361) and 51 more than Bank of Commerce Starlift (346), the two bands who dead-heated, according to the judges on Panorama night. Shell Invaders who finished second was out of the People's Choice running.

No surprises

Fonclaire was runner-up in the South Panorama to Hatters and third in the nationwide finals. For copping the People's Choice they will get \$500.

There were no other surprises in the ballots counted yesterday.

As expected, Irvin McWilliams' "Wonders of Buccoo Reef" ran away with the People's Choice for the Band of the Year in both the Savannah and Down Town competitions.

The Savannah competition carried the White Star Cup and \$500.

There the finish was "Buccoo Reef" 4,031 votes, Albert Bailey's "Kenya Ya Watu Wasuri" 702, Edmond Hart's "Butterflies and Moths" 231, Starlift's "Myths and Legends of Magic" 128, Harold Saldenah's "Festival of Tembu Warriors" 123, Lee Heung's "Yucatan" 102, Neville Aming's "Kings Confer" 46.

Seventeen other bands polled a total of 37 votes.

The Down Town results: "Buccoo Reef" 786, "Kenya" 438 and "Yucatan" 160.
