

All Stars still Panorama champions

CATELLI (TRINIDAD) ALL STARS and Amoco Renegades gave pan punters the easiest forecast when they took top honours at the Savannah on Saturday.



CATELLI ALL STARS are undoubtedly the champions. They proved this Saturday night when they won the Panorama competition at the Queen's Park Savannah for the second year running, beating 11 other bands.

In fact, the results were such a true reflection of the performances of the top four bands that, even before they were announced any "panatic" with a good steelband ear could have selected the first four in descending order.

As it was the tremendous form of All Stars was too much for the opposition with the single exception of Amoco Renegades who came within three points of the winners.

As it was All Stars with their second successive Panorama victory completed a fantastic 12-month run in which they also took the 1980 Festival honours.

In third place was Laughlin and De Gannes South Stars, who shattered any northern notion of superiority by taking Francine's "Let We Jump" scintillatingly into the first three.

Solo Harmonites who came fourth gave notice that they are back once again in the big time and Phase Two registered their significance by taking fifth place.
