

PAN TRINBAGO officials yesterday said "no way" to an appeal to shift Saturday's three-in-one Panorama, to Sunday.

A spokesman for the steelband organisation said: "We could see the wisdom of such a proposal.

"We were thinking of going back to the CDC (Carnival Development Committee) with a view of getting the date changed after seeing the proposal, but then we checked our records and saw that the dates which were put forward were by the same man who is calling for the shift."

On Sunday George Goddard, former president and Public Relations Officer of Pan Trinidad when he resigned last year, proposed the Sunday shift because he envisaged chaos on the roads, on Saturday — a working day.

It was however pointed out yesterday that the dates which Goddard had suggested when he was PRO put the semi-finals on a Saturday and the preliminaries on a Sunday.

The prelims were to be held last Sunday but were cancelled because of the

incomplete North Stand at the Queen's Park Savannah, Port of Spain.

A Pan Trinidad official said: "A shift to Sunday is now out of the question. We have already printed tickets and made all preparations for Sunday."

The CDC has already said a change was impossible.

The three in one show which is sponsored by the CDC and Pan Trinidad features the national prelims, pan-around - the-neck and zonal competitions.
