

Now it's 'Pan in a Rage' for finals

"PAN F'ever '76 will change its name to "Pan in a Rage" when the eight finalists hit the stage at the Queen's Park Savannah, Port of Spain on Saturday night.

And "Pan in a Rage" will be backed up by a massive show to be produced by dancer, Astor Johnson which will include calypsonians Salin, Relator and Fluke and poet-drummer Cheryl Byron.

The change in name was disclosed last night by Mr. Peter Aleong, public relations officer of Pan Trinbago, sponsors of the competition.

Meanwhile, four firms have donated cash prizes totalling \$8,000 for the various pan competitions.

Mootoo: My rights infringed

DR Romesh Mootoo, the Opposition politician, who had his application to drive a left-hand car turned down by Works Minister, Mr Hector McClean, intends filing a suit in the High Court on the grounds that it was an infringement of his constitutional rights.

Dr. Mootoo said

yesterday he had instructed his lawyers to take legal action.

"There is no doubt in my mind that there continues to exist a gross abuse of executive authority in this country. There have been repeated instances of discrimination under the guise of law," he added.

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
