

ANTHEM CONTEST:

\$250 FOR WINNER

HAPHAZARD arrangements of Trinidad and Tobago's National Anthem are out.

Now Cabinet has appointed a National Anthem Standards Committee to ensure that the country's national anthem is performed properly at all times and that performers will have the correct selection of music. To bring this about, government will award a \$250 prize for the best arrangement of the anthem to be selected by the Standards Committee.

The public is invited to submit arrangements to be used by symphony orchestras, military bands, steel-

bands and choirs.

Arrangements must be in full score and must carry a nom-de-plume which, together with the name and address of the arranger, must also be submitted under separate cover.

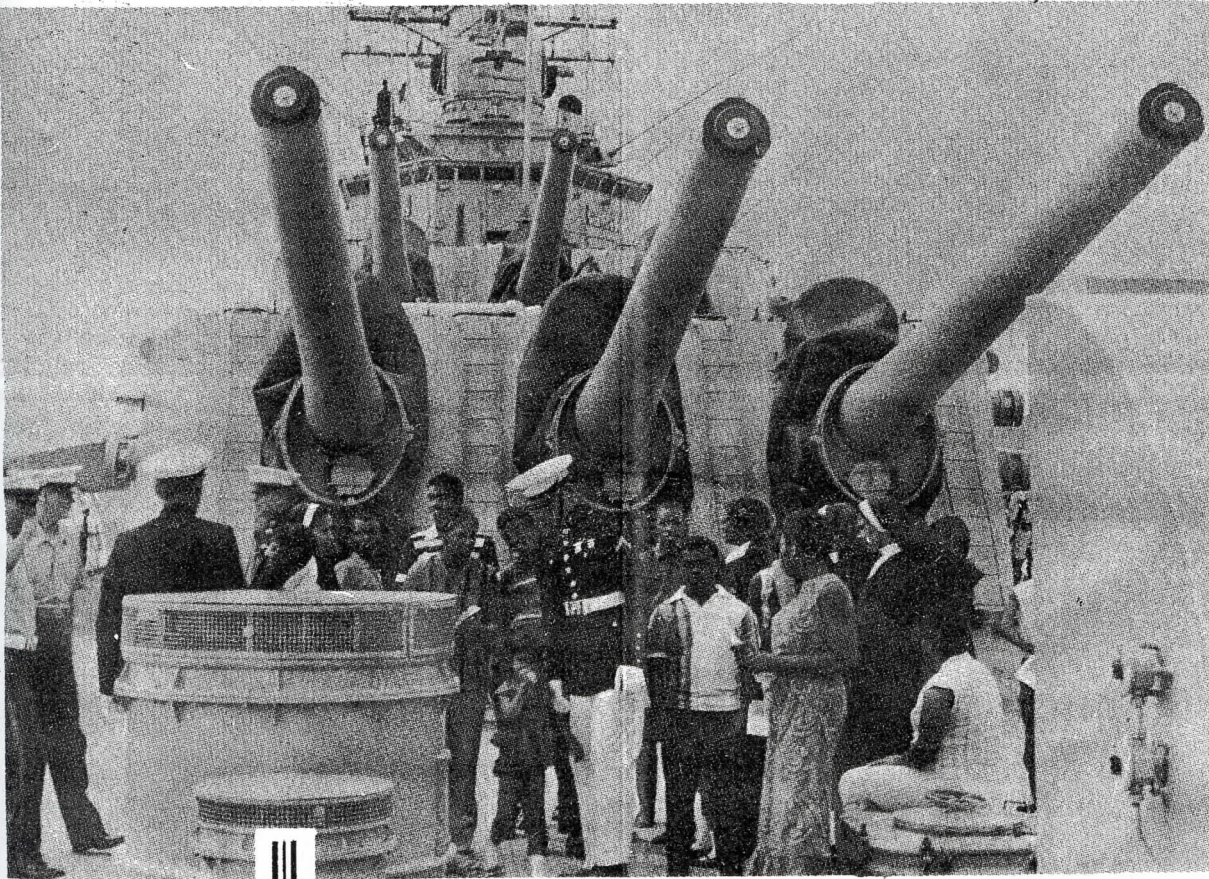
Copies of the national anthem in piano score may be had on request from the Division of Culture, stated a Whitehall statement yesterday.

Arrangement

The statement said the prize awarded by government will be for the best arrangement received in each class, and these arrangements will become government property, the statement said.

Judging will be done by a panel which will not include any persons who submitted entries. All entries except the winning ones in each section will be returned within two weeks of announcement of the awards.

Entries must reach the Director of Culture, Division of Culture, Ministry of Education and Culture, 117 Frederick Street, Port-of-Spain, before May 31, 1972.
