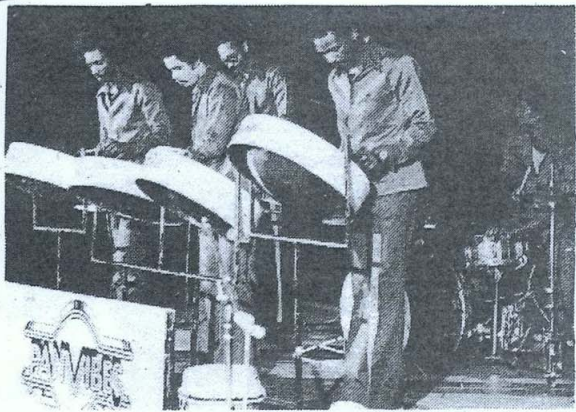
CARNIVAL 1981

Tomorrow — 7.00 p.m.

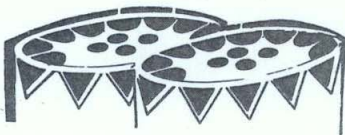
