A radiogram reports that the "Reliance" after a smooth passage, arrived on time this morning at Port of Spain, Trinidad.

The island has a population of 350,000, about a third of which, somewhat surprisingly are of East Indian origin, mostly Hindus. The rest comprise English, French, Spanish and German descendants and a large element of African Negroes. So here we have a colony owned by the British but international in character. Add that Trinidad is the land of humming birds and cockatoos and where the asphalt comes from.

C. Columbus added the island to his collection in 1498 during his third voyage of discovery and named it Trinidad for its three peaks, and his settlement, which has become the capital, Port of Spain, in honor of the jewels of Isabella.
