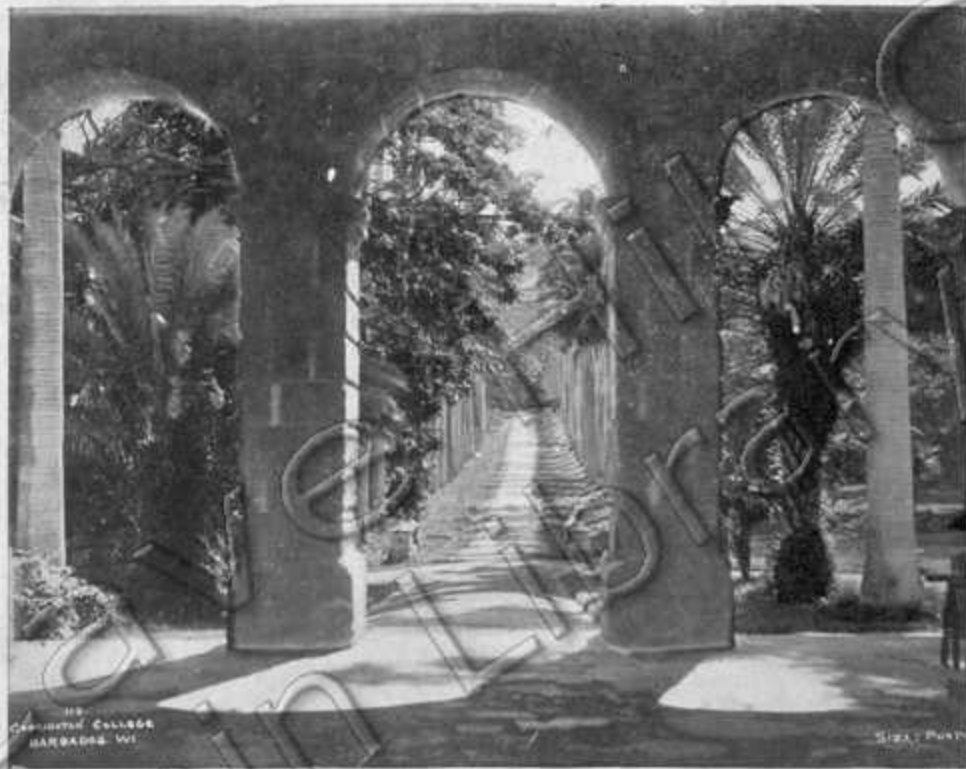

BARBADOS. Bridgetown is the port and chief town of the island of Barbados. A short line of railway connects it with outlying points. The Savannah is a popular pleasure ground, where band concerts and out-of-door games are enjoyed. Bridgetown has its Trafalgar Square and its Nelson Square, attesting the British sovereignty, although ninety per cent. of the population of the island is either pure African or of mixed blood. The population is dense, there being about 1,200 inhabitants to the square mile.
