# Arrow makes them jam

IT took Montserrat-born Calypsonian Arrow to bring the crowd alive at the North/East Panorama preliminaries yesterday afternoon at the Queen's Park Savannah.

Arrow appeared on stage waving the flag ahead of Jet Age Valley Harps while his tune, "Long Time," was being played on the public address system prior to it being performed by the pride of Petit Valley.

The 20,000-odd crowd in both the Grand and North Stands raised their hands in the air and "jammed" as the calypso beckons to do.

Scheduled to start at 1 p.m.,

proceedings did not get underway until 2:15 p.m. The first band, Jay Notes was ready to play at 2 p.m. but a shower of rain chased the players off stage.

The rain again delayed proceedings with the next band, Birdsong, which eventually performed "Pan Night and Day" by Kitchener.

Reigning national Panorama champs AMOCO Renegades, with a spirited performance of the same "Pan Night and Day" gave early warning that they are going to be hard to beat. They were lustily applauded by the crowd.
