Pan Trinbago gets more Trincity land

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PAN TRINBAGO president Patrick Arnold confirmed yesterday that his organisation received a letter of approval from Minister in the Ministry of Finance Christine Sahadeo, during a distribution ceremony held at Sevilla Club in Brechin Castle, Couva on Wednesday.

Arnold said that his organisation applied for a further three acres of land since before 2000, given the magnitude of its

Trincity project where the Pan Headquarters will be relocated upon completion of construction of a building.

And apart from the headquarters, a chroming factory among other projects is also earmarked to be erected on the site.

Arnold wanted to make it very clear that the three acres of land applied for and for which Pan Trinbago got the letter of approval on Wednesday, is situated right next to the existing

eight acres of land in Trincity and not in Caroni, as some people believe.

He said when his organisation sought the first eight acres in Trincity, they applied to owners Caroni 1975 Ltd.

But with the State having full control of these lands, they will now have to go to the State Lands Commission to obtain a deed for the additional three acres of the once Caroni 1975 Ltd lands.
