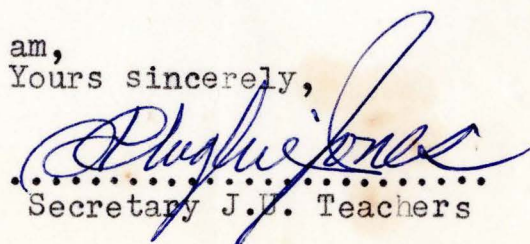
- a) Age Grouping in Schools

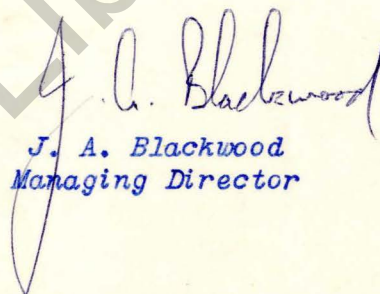

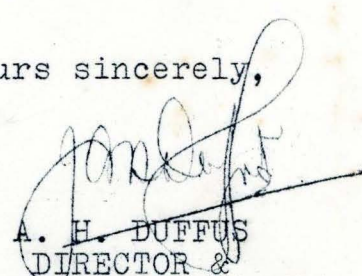
