Mount on poster board

Label using name, age, class, school, contact details and title of poster

Posters should capture the message, be creative, visually attractive, clean, neat with correct spelling, age appropriate and include use of design principles (line, shape, texture, space, colour and unity)

Certificate of participation for all participants
