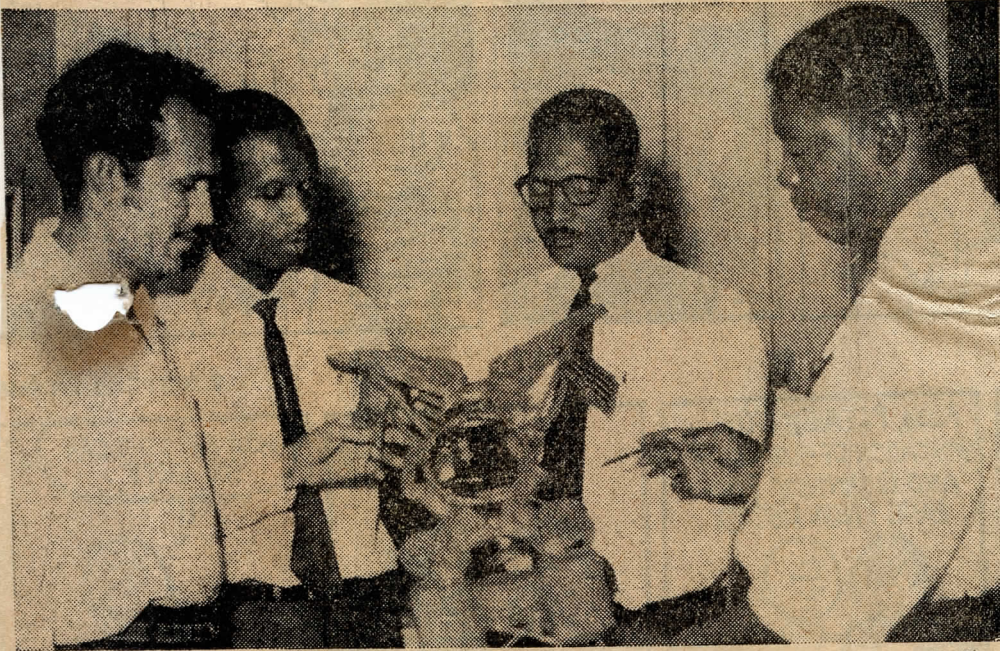

THE Trinidad and Tobago Steel Orchestras Association, as a gesture of appreciation, will present the 10th U.S. Naval District Steel Orchestra with a carved plaque tomorrow afternoon, on the occasion of the steelband jamboree at the U.S. Naval Station at Chaguaramas. The jamboree starts at 2 o'clock. It is scheduled to last two and a half hours.

The jamboree is being sponsored jointly by the Association and the U.S. Naval Station. It is open to the public.

Presentation of the plaque, says the Association, will not only mark the first ever steelband session at the Base, but will indicate the friendly relations which exist between the association and executives and members of the naval band.

Spice of variety will be added to the jamboree by the March of Dimes, leading vocal group in the island, and the Mighty Dougla, Calypso King of Trinidad and Tobago, for 1961.
