

# \$30,000 MORE FOR STEELBANDS

OFFICIALS of the Joint Management Committee of Pan Trinbago and the Carnival Development Committee announced yesterday that another of the new steelband competitions, designed to lure steelbands back on to the road during Carnival Monday and Tuesday, has received a sponsor.

Jaleel and Company, producers of Cole Cole, and 7-Up beverages, has donated \$30,000 as prize money in the "Bomb" competition, which will take place on J'Ouvert morning. In this competition, prizes go to the best steelbands beating non-calypso tunes.

In another development, Roy Boyke, member of the Joint Management Committee, has said that

tickets for pre-carnival shows have not yet been sold out. Tickets for the Dimanche Gras show, Childrens' Carnival, Calypso Fiesta, and other shows are on sale during the day at the Grand Stand, Queen's Park Savannah.

"I can state with confidence that tickets to all shows are still available," Mr. Boyke told the EXPRESS yesterday.
