## RULES

---

1. The Club shall be called the "Corinthian-Casuals Football Club."

2. The colours shall be as follows:—

(a) Chocolate and pink (old Casuals colours).

All members shall be entitled to wear these colours.

(b) Blue and white (old Corinthian colours).

Only past members of the Corinthian F.C. and new members specially elected in accordance with Rule 8 shall be entitled to wear these colours.

They shall be worn for foreign tours, special matches and public school matches, with cap, stockings and badge, by those entitled to do so.

3. (a) The Officers of the Club shall consist of the President, Vice-Presidents, Hon. Treasurer or Treasurers, Hon. Secretary or Secretaries and the Captain of the First Eleven, who shall be elected annually at the Annual General Meeting.

(b) The management of the Club shall be vested in an Executive Committee which shall consist of the Officers of the Club and twelve members who shall also be elected annually at the Annual General Meeting. The Captains of the Association Football Clubs of Oxford, Cambridge and London Universities shall be ex-officio members of the Executive Committee during their respective term of office.

(c) Five members of the Executive Committee shall form a quorum and the Executive Committee may co-opt special members not exceeding five in number.

(d) The Chairman of the Executive Committee shall also be elected annually at the Annual General Meeting.

(e) In the event of an equality of votes at a meeting of the Executive Committee the Chairman, in addition to his ordinary vote, shall be entitled to exercise a casting vote.

(f) The Executive Committee may appoint Sub-Committees of its number for such purposes and in such manner as it may think fit.

4. The Annual General Meeting shall be held during the months of May or June:—

(a) to receive a report of the previous year, together with a Balance Sheet and Statement of Accounts, duly audited by an Hon. Auditor or Auditors elected at the previous Annual General Meeting. No Officer of the Club shall be eligible to be elected as Honorary Auditor.

(b) to elect Officers and members of the Executive Committee of the Club for the current year.

Notice of such meeting shall be sent to all members not less than fifteen days before, and notice of any private member's resolution to be moved at such meeting shall be received by the Hon. Secretary not less than seven days prior to the meeting, with the name of the proposer and seconder.

5. An Extraordinary General Meeting may be called by the Executive Committee at any time but the Hon.

Secretary or Secretaries shall call such a meeting within seven days of the receipt of a written request signed by not less than fifteen members. Not less than seven days' notice shall be given of all such meetings and the notice shall state the purpose for which any such meeting has been called.

6. **Membership.** All members of the Corinthian F.C. and The Casuals F.C. at the time of the formation of the new Club shall be members.

- (a) CADET MEMBERS who were under the age of 19 on the first day of September prior to the date of their election or who are still undergoing their term of National Service shall pay an annual subscription of 5s.
- (b) STUDENT MEMBERS who are "in statu pupillari" at a University, Hospital or similar place of learning shall pay an annual subscription of £1 1s. 0d.
- (c) PLAYING MEMBERS not covered by (a) or (b) above shall pay an annual subscription of £2 2s. 0d.
- (d) NON-PLAYING MEMBERS shall pay an annual subscription of £1 1s. 0d., but members of the Corinthian Football Club who were not members of The Casuals Football Club at the time of the formation of the new club shall be entitled to continue their membership without payment of subscription.

**Election of new members.** Every candidate for election must be proposed and seconded at a meeting of the Executive Committee by a member of the Executive

Committee or a captain of one of the teams, and such candidate must be known personally by his proposer and seconder. The names of all candidates shall be circularised to the Executive Committee, together with the names of the proposers and seconds, with the notice calling the next Executive Committee Meeting. Candidates to whom no objection is received in writing, or at such meeting, will be automatically elected. Subscriptions shall become due on election and on the first day of September in each subsequent year.

The Executive Committee shall have power to cancel the membership of any person whose subscription is three months in arrear provided one month's notice in writing of such intended action is sent to the member's last known address.

**Voting.** All members shall be entitled to vote at General Meetings of the Club.

7. The Annual General Meeting shall have power to elect as Life Members a limited number of persons (not more than five at any one meeting) who have rendered distinguished service to the Club.

Original Life Members shall consist of Corinthian Life Members and the Casuals Vice-Presidents at the time of the formation of the Club, subject to their consent.

8. The Executive Committee of the Club shall have the right each year to elect a limited number of members who, for special playing ability, are considered to have merited the award of Corinthian Colours, i.e., cap, badge and stockings.

9. The Club shall enter for such cups and competitions and play such other matches as the Executive Committee shall, from time to time, decide.

10. Tours at home shall be arranged under the Club's name. Tours abroad and special matches may, where authorised by the Committee, be arranged under the title of "Corinthian Football Club."

11. Team Managers shall be appointed to take charge of matches against Public Schools.

12. **Alteration to Rules.** If any alteration is considered necessary in the Rules of the Club, notice of the same, together with the names of the proposers and seconders, shall be sent to the Hon. Secretary on or before May 1st in each year, and copies of such proposals shall be sent to the members with the notice convening the General Meeting. No alterations shall be made unless approved by two-thirds of the members present and voting at the General Meeting.

**11.15 a.m.** Motor coach with Scottish team will leave St. Ermins Hotel, Westminster for Hendon Hall Hotel for luncheon and then on to Wembley Stadium.

**1.30 p.m.** Motor coach with England team will leave for Wembley.

**3.00 p.m.** MATCH (see Section II).

**6.00 p.m.—6.30 p.m.** Dinner for Officials of The Football Association, the Scottish F.A., and players of both teams, at White's Hotel, Lancaster Gate.



After the presentation the National Anthem will be played. The Bandmaster will receive a signal from Sir Stanley Rous. The players may then "kick-about" until the Referee calls the Captains together to begin the game. The Referee must not start the match until Viscount Montgomery is seated in the Royal Box.

**3.00 p.m.** Kick-off. At half-time the players will leave the field as usual, but the interval must not exceed 10 minutes. Immediately the match is over the National Anthem will be played and the players will line up in the centre of the field facing the Royal Box, the match officials in the centre, and will remain on the field until its completion. The ball will be brought from the field by the Referee and returned to an official of The Football Association.

### *SECTION III*

#### **Referee and Linesmen.**

The Referee and Linesmen are asked to be at the Offices of The Football Association, 22 Lancaster Gate, W.2, at 11 a.m. on the day of the match.

From Lancaster Gate, a car will take the referee and linesmen to Wembley for lunch; Mr. H. N. Bird (F.A. Staff) will act as liaison officer.

A room at the Stadium will be placed at the disposal of the three match officials. They are instructed to wear blazers of a colour distinguishing them from the competing players. (N.B.—As the Scottish Team will play in navy blue shirts and white shorts, and the England Team in white shirts and dark blue shorts, a blazer other than blue or white will be suitable.)

Mr. Knowles will see that refreshments are provided for the three officials in their dressing room at half-time and at the end of the match. Flags for the Linesmen will be provided by The Football Association.

### *SECTION IV*

#### **Footballs and Linesmen's Flags.**

The Footballs will be supplied by a few selected firms who have instructions to deliver a ball, without markings, to the Offices of the Association on the day of the match. They will report to him at the Empire Pool, Wembley, not later than 12 noon, and be under his charge. 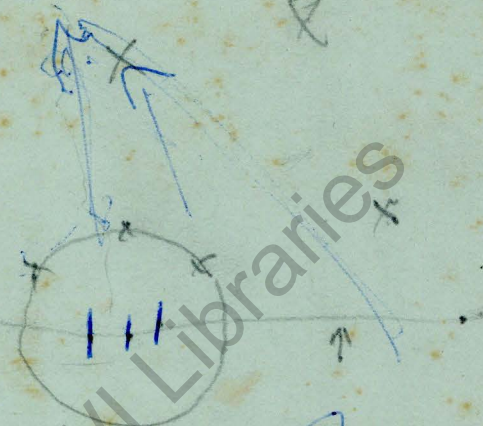

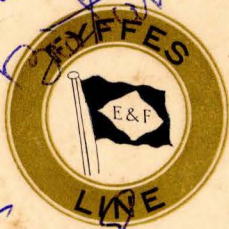
