### NOTE

For most undergraduate courses the approximate total cost for all compulsory fees is £70 and for post-graduate courses £50. These fees are paid in full at the beginning of the Session. At present the weekly charge for staying in a College Hall of Residence is £4 8s. 0d. which covers room charges, full board at weekends, and breakfast and an evening meal on weekdays. These dues are paid terminally in advance. In addition to these expenses and the cost of other normal items of maintenance, allowance must be made for books, instruments, stationery, vacation courses, etc. The amount required to cover these will depend on the subjects studied.

- (a) *Medical Certificate of Fitness* (Original and three copies). A special note should be made in the medical certificate if the candidate has suffered any serious illness in the past or if there has been any history of mental trouble in the family.
  - (b) *One testimonial* as to character from the Headmaster or other School Authority of a School attended. (Original and three copies).
  - (c) *Three small photographs.*
  - (d) *A short essay* written by the applicant about himself, his education and the reasons for choosing his career or a particular subject for special study. Proficiency at games and other interests and hobbies should be indicated.
2. Applicants for a course of professional training need to show that they possess special aptitude for the desired course, or have already gained certain technical qualifications.
