Chairman Of Rice Arbitration Body Sought

GEORGETOWN, British Guiana, July 9.—The Secretary of State for the Colonies, Mr. James Griffiths, in keeping with contractual arrangements, will be asked to nominate a chairman of a committee of arbitration to examine a rice prices dispute involving three West Indian Islands as buyers, and the British Guiana Rice Marketing Board as supplier.

The Board sought increased prices to meet the increased cost of production coupled with the increased cost of living brought mainly by the increased cost of United Kingdom imports and there has been a breakdown in negotiations with Barbados, Trinidad and St. Lucia, while Antigua and St. Vincent have agreed to the new prices.
