

Kitch's tunes favoured at South preliminaries

PAN FEVER swept San Fernando yesterday.

The South Trinidad Panorama preliminaries brought out 20-odd steelbands, hundreds of pan beaters and an estimated 40,000 spectators, with another 3,000 failing to gain entry.

Fifteen bands were being chosen for the semi-finals scheduled for Friday night also at Skinner Park.

By 5 o'clock only 12 bands had crossed the stage.

And it looked like another year for Kitchener. Nine of them beat out Kitch's tunes, two favoured Sparrow and one played Short Shirt's Tourist Leggo.
