## Peters and Nicholas talk on broadening pan in UK

**Trinidad and Tobago's High Commissioner to London, Garvin Nicholas, paid a courtesy call on Minister of the Arts and Multiculturalism, Winston "Gypsy" Peters on Monday morning.**

After being welcomed by Minister Peters, Nicholas thanked the minister for hosting him at his ministry's Frederick Street, Port-of-Spain, offices.

The two gentlemen

had discussions on a wide range of matters, including collaboration between the Ministry of the Arts and Multiculturalism and the London High Commission to embark on broadening the introduction of the full range of steel-pan instruments to the British school system.

Nicholas also discussed aspirations of having Trinidad and Tobago nationals domiciled in Great Britain cel-

brate annual national holidays, including Emancipation Day, Divali and Eid and Republic Day, similar to how it is done at home.

The planning of special events in London to commemorate next year's 50th anniversary celebration of Trinidad and Tobago's Independence, was also among the subjects discussed.

Nicholas is in Trinidad and Tobago on a short official visit.
